WATCH >>> Marta Vieira da Silva. Known only by her first name, this Brazilian lady has been FIFA World Player of the Year five times (2006 – 2010). A silver medal winner with her national team in 2004 and 2008, Marta tops the all-time Women's World Cup goalscorer list. And she's rightly recognised as one of the best ever.

winning gold both times. Regarded as one of

WATCH >> Roger Federer. The choice of grass as the Olympic playing surface couldn't be better for the serial-winning Swiss who harbours hopes of gold in the singles. Britain's Andy Murray won't be too far behind Federer in his appreciation though. And Novak Djokovic and Rafael Nadal, sitting atop the ATP rankings, will have something to say about who gets what medal. Jo-Wilfried Tsonga, John Isner and Juan Martin Del Potro will also be in the mix, all capable of causing an upset.

WATCH >>> Elena Dementieva. She's the returning champion, keen to keep her crown. But expect some hot competition from Petra Kvitova, Maria Sharapova, Victoria Azarenka, and Caroline Wozniacki. Then throw the Williams sisters, Venus and Serena, into the fray. Even though injury and age may be catching up with them, you just can't write them off. Outside bets? Look to Na Li, and Agnieszka Radwanska.
